# Turn Out Tampa to Stop Toll Lanes on Interstate Highways

Organization petitions MPO Board in StopTBX action

Tampa, Fla., August 3, 2015 — Sunshine Citizens, a non-partisan grassroots Tampa Bay area advocacy group representing thousands of citizens fighting for smarter growth and transit solutions, announces a major action: Turn Out Tampa- Stop TBX, aimed at thwarting the Tampa Bay Express project (TBX). Concerned citizens will rally and attend the Metropolitan Planning Organization Board meeting, Tuesday, August 4, 5:30 p.m., at the Hillsborough Fredrick B. Karl County Center (601 E. Kennedy Blvd., Tampa).

Together with a coalition of like-minded advocacy groups, neighborhood associations and business owners, the group is mobilizing concerned citizens to petition the Metropolitan Planning Organization of Hillsborough County to remove the Florida Department of Transportation's TBX project from the five-year Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP).

As part of their ongoing outreach and efforts to educate Tampa Bay area residents about the negative impacts of the TBX project, the group has organized hundreds of citizens to bike, ride the bus and attend the board meeting.

This major action represents the growing movement of concerned residents that want the MPO to remove TBX from the TIP and slow down FDOT's acceleration of the project, to allow for more time for community participation and input about how the area moves forward with regional transportation. The group recently co-hosted with several organizations a community town hall educational forum that drew over 250 attendees to learn about the plan, and its negative impacts on the culture, economy, quality of life, and future growth of the Tampa Region.

"At a projected cost of \$9 billion, FDOT's TBX plan introduces variable rate toll lanes to Tampa's interstate highways. The plan does not provide HOV (high occupancy vehicle) lanes, or dedicated funding for transit planning, expanding current HART bus service or plans for light rail," said Chris Vela, president of Sunshine Citizens. "This plan creates a highway that is only for outlying area commuters, as access to and from these lanes doesn't exist

within Tampa. It eliminates exits and cuts off access to downtown, punishing nearby urban core neighborhoods by isolating them and destroying irreplaceable historic assets."

The group already expects well over 200 attendees to the MPO board meeting August 4, and the county has moved the meeting from smaller rooms to the Board of County Commissioners Chambers, to try to accommodate expected turnout. Attendees will address the board during public comments, as this is the only means they have to address the project- it will not be brought to referendum or public vote.

To demonstrate the need for multi modal transportation and opposition to the TBX plan, Sunshine Citizens will Turn Out Tampa to Stop TBX in several ways:

We need more viable economic modeling and a funding commitment to transit for our transportation needs."
